IN RE: COURT OPERATIONS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

On March 16, 2020, the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern and Western

Districts of Arkansas suspended all in person hearings until further notice in recognition of and in

deference to the possible pandemic ramifications of the COVID-19 virus. Since that time, the

Bankruptcy Clerk's offices in both Little Rock and Fayetteville, Arkansas, have remained open

and operational. In addition, the court has continued operations by conducting hearings and trials

both telephonically and by video conferencing and will continue to do so through May 31, 2021.

Beginning, June 1, 2021, the court will resume in person hearings and trials in all divisions.

The court has developed guidelines for conducting in person hearings and trials for the Central and

Fayetteville (including Harrison cases) divisions. The same guidelines, in addition to any

guidelines required by local practices, will be enforced in the Delta, El Dorado, Fort Smith, Hot

Springs, Northern, and Texarkana divisions. The guidelines for in person hearings and trials,

including social distancing, will be available on the court's website. The guidelines may be revised

from time to time. The court recognizes that there may be members of the bar or parties with

special circumstances who may not desire to attend in person. The guidelines address those special

circumstances. Anyone who does attend an in person hearing or trial will be expected to adhere

to the posted guidelines.
